2009 a Year of Change for the OAA

Shortly after the mailing of that newsletter, Todd McNelly resigned from the Vice President's position as well.

These resignations left some big shoes to be filled and, fortunately, several OAA members have stepped up to the challenge. Bob Holden and Jeremy Evans moved from District Governor positions to fill the vacant seats of President and Vice President,

respectively. The vacated District Governor positions were immediately filled by Seth Adams and Ken Gibson. We have also added Dan Lane as Treasurer and Charles Hargrave as Web Editor.

We'll introduce you to each of the new officers later in this newsletter, but the change in officers isn't the only change worth noting. These new officers haven't wasted any time in getting to work to make some changes in hopes of continuing to grow our attendance and to create an enjoyable tournament experience for our members and guests. OAA is Going Green

No, we're not changing the color of the logo. Beginning in 2010, all registration forms will contain a space for email addresses. Throughout the next year, we will begin producing an email version of this newsletter and will be moving away from the paper copies.

For some time, paper copies will still be available to those without email access as we make this transition. We have been researching online newsletter

services and are close to making a selection. This service will allow us to send an unlimited number of newsletters and updates at a yearly cost that is less than the cost to publish just one paper newsletter. We will also be able to expand our outreach to include OAA members and non-OAA members alike, without increasing the cost of producing this information.

Your email addresses will be used for the sole purpose of OAA communications and will not be sold or shared with any other group or organization.

New for 2010 - The Governor's Cup

After hearing quite a few members from across the state express a desire to compete for bragging rights at the district level, we are proud to present to you the *Governor's Cup*. The *Governor's Cup* is a district championship 300 round that will be scheduled per district sometime between Jan 1st and Feb 14th. Exact dates and locations will be posted on the OAA website as they become available and will be highlighted again in the winter newsletter.

The *Governor's Cup* will be awarded to the highest score in each class in each district. Archers may shoot in any district, but scores will apply to the district of residency.

The varied dates may tempt you to shoot in more than one district, but archers may only shoot one score for the *Governor's Cup*. Any archer who signs in and begins shooting but does not complete the round or does not turn in a score card will receive an official score of zero points for the event.

This event will be open to guests. Guests will not be eligible to win the *Governor's Cup*, but high guest scores will be recognized.

Any scoring ties will be broken by X count. If a tie still exists, the tie will then be broken by the first X dropped. If a tie still exists beyond this, the tied shooters will compete in a head to head shoot-off at the OAA Indoor 300. Any shooter scheduled to appear in a

shoot-off who does not show up will forfeit the win. All awards will be presented at the OAA Indoor 300.

Because this is a district level event, no Shooter of the Year points will be awarded and this does not count toward the Iron Archer award. Similar to the mail-in events, there will be no **Money Class offered at the Governor's Cup**.

Your *Governor's Cup* score will count as a classifier score for the OAA Indoor 300 Championships. The 300 **Classifier's will also continue to operate** at affiliated clubs the same as in **years' past, but the dates have been** extended to February 14th this year to allow more time for those who are interested to post a classifier score.

We are very excited to bring to you this new opportunity to compete and hope that all of you will take advantage of the chance to battle it out for bragging rights within your district.

OAA Adds New Money Class to 5 Tournaments

Looking for a new twist to the same old game **we've all been shooting for so long? Is it hard for you to get excited about shooting for another wooden plaque to hang on your wall? As it turns out, you're not alone. After hearing these comments from several members, we have decided to add a Money Class to our 5 premier events: the Indoor 300, Spring Bowhunter, State Field, Outdoor 600, and Fall Bowhunter.**

We are hoping that this might encourage more participation in our events by providing additional opportunities to our members and guests. Participants interested in this class will pay \$40 to enter. \$30 of this fee will be paid out to the class with the remainder being split between the host club and the OAA.

The registration cost for this class will not apply

toward the family max pricing. Family pricing will only include those family members registering for the standard OAA/NFAA championship classes. Anyone who chooses to participate in this class will not be eligible for a Championship title or Shooter of the Year points for that event.

There will be a men's and women's division in the Money Class, which will be open to adults only. There will be no further breakdown of this class based on equipment so it is, as they say, a "run what you bring" class. Since there will be no state title on the line, members and guests will compete together for the same prize money.

This class will be in place for the 2010 calendar year and will be evaluated at the end of the season to determine its future.

We also offer our congratulations to **Doug Sheliga**, our first winner of the Shooter of the Year title in the Senior Division.
